




Dear Grandma,



When I was young I loved Wales Drive, I have the fondest memories since I was five.


I loved to cuddle next to you at the piano, You always played nicely and gave me a show.

Happy Birthday, Grandma!



On this spectacular occasion, we share with you some specific thoughts about you—our very special grandmother.






Thank you for the memories
